Renewal and Change - Not Just for Missionaries

We have a small pool here named the Pool of Siloam. The name Siloam, which means "sent," is pulled from the account of Jesus healing the blind man in John 9. For us, it is a daily reminder of the reason we exist - to provide housing and biblical hospitality to the missionaries, the "sent" ones, who come to this property to rest, refresh, and be sent back out.

Recently a work team spent a week cleaning and renewing our Pool of Siloam. This struck a chord with me as it reminded me that ministries, and the people doing the ministries, must also take time to renew or the things that are important will be lost. Ministering to those who have spiritual, physical, and emotional needs is difficult if you yourself are facing the same problems and the same potential for burnout.

You can easily see the huge change in the before and after photos. But, we are also currently in the process of working on other things that are





hard to show visually. Not only are we updating several of our older homes to make them more effective in the healing process for the families we serve, but we have also embarked on several organizational changes focused on efficiency and long-term stability. The revamp of our operations is important as it sets a strong foundation for our sustainability, but it does come at a cost and isn't something we can show you in a picture.

We take seriously our calling to make sure this is a place of healing, but we need your help. Like many nonprofits, our current giving is down for the year, but we are at a critical juncture in our current work. 








Dear Coffee Club Members,

Many of you poured your own blood, sweat and tears into helping us, prayed with us and watched God do miracle after miracle. It was amazing, wasn't it? HAM DELIGHTS

It is that time of the year when we are having parties and family get-togethers. This is a great mini sandwich to serve. Enjoy.

Ingredients:

- 2 packages of Party Rolls
- 8 oz. of sliced Ham
- 8 oz. of sliced Swiss cheese
- 1 stick of butter
- 1 Med. Onion, chopped
- 1-1/2 T. Poppy Seed
- 1-1/2 T. Mustard
- 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce

Directions:

Slice the top layer of each package of rolls without breaking apart. On bottom half, layer ham and cheese. Mix the remaining ingredients and spread on the other half of rolls and place over ham and cheese. Cover with foil and let sit at least 30 minutes or refrigerate overnight. Bake at 350 degrees 15 to 20 minutes until warm and cheese melts.
