We praise the Lord for the progress on the missionary home currently under construction. It is exciting to once again see how God uses the talents of so many different people, each person having different gifts, but one common




goal - to build another missionary home. The foundation is getting closer to being complete. The next step will be to finish the brick and start on framing the house. The new house is being built next door to where I live. So each morning, as I have my devotions, I can look out my study and see the progress.



The scripture this morning is found in Psalm 5. My Bible's caption says, "a prayer of guidance, a morning prayer." Verse 3 really was a comfort to me that in the quietness of the morning, God listens to me when I pray. "My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O Lord." My prayer this morning is that the Lord will continue to use all of us to complete this home. This is house #14! Hard to believe — I still remember building the first house back in 1993.

A missionary applies through an application process to stay at Siloam. Once approved, we put them on a waiting list. The average stay for a missionary family is 9-12 months. About 90% of them return every two to four years. Yet, we only have so many houses. Last year, Siloam Missionary Homes had to turn

away 37 missionary families because all of our homes were full. I realize we cannot provide homes for every missionary family, but God has given us places to build here on our campus, so we continue to build. I would like to encourage you, dear friend, as you spend your quiet time with the Lord, to help us pray about completing this home. We are praying that we can have this home completed debt free by the end of the year. So, we will have one more home for another missionary family.



Estimated construction cost \$135,000.00

In closing, the end of verse 3 says, "in the morning I will direct my prayer unto thee, and I will look up." Isn't it exciting that the writer of Psalms not only prayed, but afterwards looked up to see God answer his prayer? I hope this will encourage you to look up as we partner together on this missionary home to see the mighty hand of God at work.
