





## House #15 | The Caretakers Apartment at Camp Glory Farm

We praise the Lord for the provision of a beautiful double wide that was donated and moved over to Camp Glory Farm. Once completed, this home will be used by the Caretaker of the farm and RV camping. It will also house the camp office.

#### PHASE 1

- The footers were dug and poured Completed 6/13
- The plumbing under the house had to be replaced due to the move. (All the materials were donated) *Completed 11/13*
- The Septic and well were already there. Need to be hooked up. *Completed 11/13*
- The Electric from the double wide to the meter in conduit \$200.00

Completion of phase 1 - \$200.00

### PHASE 2

Foundation walls, replace shingles, install new windows and doors, and repair siding

- 400 4"x8"x16" foundation cement blocks @ \$1.42 ea. \$568.00
- 20 80# backs of type s mortar @ \$5.63 a bag \$112.60
- 20 Foundation vents @ \$16.05 \$321.00
- 2 loads of sand @ \$25.00 \$50
- 50 bdls. Shingles @ \$30.00 \$1,500
- Install new windows and doors (donated)
- Vinyl siding 4 corners and 2 squares of siding and trim for replacement windows Approx. \$500.00

Completion of phase 2 - \$ 3,051.60

Project cost total for the completion of phase 1 and 2 is \$3,251.06



## HONEY BUN CAKE RECIPE

Here's one of my family's favorite recipes — one that is great for the holiday season. I hope you will enjoy it with your family. - Betty Wilder

- 1 box Yellow Cake Mix ½ cup Sugar
- 1 cup Buttermilk

- 3/4 cup Vegetable Oil
- 4 eggs, beaten well

Preheat Oven to 300 degrees. Mix all ingredients together beating well.

#### Cinnamon Swirl:

• ½ cup packed Light Brown Sugar • 2 tsp. Ground Cinnamon

Mix all ingredients together in separate bowl. Pour batter in greased and floured 11 X 13 inch pan. Sprinkle cinnamon mixture on top and swirl down through the batter with a knife, making a marbled effect. Bake for 40-50 minutes at 300 degrees. Remove from oven.

#### Glaze:

• 1 cup Confectioners' Sugar • 1 tbsp. Milk (a little more if glaze is too thick Mix glaze ingredients and spread over hot cake. Let cake cool before cutting.
