- A group has stepped forward to raise funds to furnish the new house.
- Our farm manager, Kendric Peoples, was married late this summer to Noah Tyre, a former intern here at Siloam.
- We were able to provide housing for 26 families this year.
- God provided strength and healing for missionaries and staff this year as we faced COVID, surgeries, and other health issues.
- Several work teams came this year and we were able to complete a massive structural repair on Unit E, update the Wreck Center and the Treasure Chest, and begin the update to the front entrance of the property.

We wish we could share all that God has done this year, but there is just not enough space in one letter to do so. But we do ask that you would rejoice with us in all that God has done. Our faith increases as we have opportunity to trust Him even in sometimes chaotic circumstances.

Please pray for the missionaries. Several of them are in the process of transitioning to a new field of service and it seems that conditions and processes change on almost a daily basis. The uncertainties around the world present challenges for families trying to make plans to go overseas as well as those who will be remaining here in the United States.

The board and staff would like to thank you for being a part of the work here at Siloam. Whether through your financial gifts or prayers, you too are being used to minister to these precious saints who are obedient and faithful in their service to Him. We do not do this work alone. We lean on your support and prayers and on the almighty hands of our great God.

We are grateful for the words of Paul in I Thessalonians 5:24, "Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it." This work we do together here at Siloam Missionary Homes is His work.
