URGENT NEED!



We recently discovered a manhole sized opening in the ground in our main parking lot.

Upon further inspection that hole revealed a much larger cavity that had developed under our parking lot. The drainage pipe that was installed when the main office building was constructed had suffered a catastrophic failure and created a sinkhole, which continues to grow every time it rains. We have already pursued a claim with our insurance company, but this type of issue is not covered by our policy. If we end up needing to buy the materials directly from a supplier, the pipe alone will be close to \$20,000, not including the excavation, removal, and reinstallation of the new pipe.

Would you prayerfully consider assisting Siloam Missionary Homes with this financial need? We know that God was not surprised when this hole appeared and we trust that He will be glorified as the provision for this need is met.

Missionary Care is More Than a House

Missionaries come to Siloam Missionary Homes with a variety of needs. Missionary Care is more than supplying a house for a missionary family to stay in while on “home assignment” or “furlough.” Betty and I came to this well-established ministry 15 years ago and have seen how it has met the needs of missionary families in so many ways. Let me name a few in which Siloam has played a significant part.

- Siloam has been a place of healing in family relationships, physical healing, mending marital difficulties and attending to problems with children. Sometimes children of missionaries have difficulty leaving the friends they have grown up with on the mission field. Being at Siloam with other children from similar situations helps them cope.

- Having SMH as a location from which to visit churches and individuals that support their ministry or to seek support is a blessing. Missionaries have a place they can call home for a while, coming and going as they have need.
- Missionaries staying with us have family members they need to visit, perhaps parents who are ill or

whom they have not seen in years because of their overseas ministry.

- Several families have stayed with us who had to leave the field because of threats to their safety, an emergency evacuation or a security breach, with only a few hours to pack what they could and leave the country. Siloam provided the families a safe place to “breathe” again, such as one family escaping from armed conflict on the street in front of their house overseas.
- Siloam’s location near top-ranked hospital facilities has allowed a number of families to get the medical help they needed. A family with a child who had a heart defect came to stay here and found they were only a few miles from the location of one of the best heart surgeons in the U.S. who provided care.
- Siloam was here to help when a missionary couple’s infant son died due to a birth defect while they stayed with us.

These are a few examples of the help SMH provides to missionary families. We are here to listen, pray with, encourage and provide care in whatever ways we can. When you support Siloam through your prayers, gifts and volunteering you are making a difference in meeting the needs of missionaries, helping equip them to make known the gospel message of Christ.

In October, Larry ended up having a partial knee replacement after stepping down off of a ladder incorrectly. He recovered pretty quickly compared to a lot of the stories we heard about knee surgeries, so we were thankful for that. He says that he is pain free now, which is a blessing.

Once he recovered, I decided to check out an old shoulder injury that had begun to give me quite a bit of pain. After my MRI, the doctor told me I had two torn tendons and needed surgery. So, on February 2nd, I underwent shoulder surgery. My recovery from that is going pretty well and I am doing physical therapy twice a week. I am so grateful that this kind of procedure is available to us....at another time in history or in other places, I would not be able to get relief and heal from this. So, I praise the Lord.

Today, we will say goodbye to one of our missionary families who are returning to their ministry in Tanzania. We grew to love them and will miss them...that is one of the hard parts of what we do here at Siloam. But we are thankful that they were able to come and rest here. They commented to Rachel yesterday that this is the first time that on furlough they were able to have a home of their own and how much that meant to their college age daughters who were able to come "home" to visit. Thank you for helping make this possible for families like this one.
