Scripture to help keep us focused on what matters. In Colossians 4:2-6 we find Paul encouraging believers to pray with several things in mind. Pray with thanksgiving. Pray for opportunity. opportunities to minister every day and not miss an opportunity because we are fixated on something that is spiritually trivial. Being in ministry does not mean we always have the answers! When we are presented with questions or situations that are outside our knowledge or experience, we can rely on God to guide our thoughts and actions. Many of these missionaries go through things that our staff can only imagine, but we are not limited in our ministry to them because we can go to God who has all the answers. He will even direct us in the way we answer and provide counsel. Helping us to minister to needs at the right time and in the right way.

We are constantly reminded here at Siloam that our primary ministry is to His servants and while we have specific roles on the property, we cannot forget to take time to fulfill our calling to the missionaries He chooses to send our way.

The Blessings of Ministry Updates

ne of the blessings of serving at Siloam Missionary Homes is getting to know missionaries who come from ministering in many places in the world. Added to that blessing is being on their mailing list and hearing about their ministry after they return to the field. We pray for many different missions, but learning about how God is working through fellow believers whom you know personally is special. Email makes it possible to receive ministry updates from missionaries all over the world. I consider it part of my ministry to missionaries to keep in touch with as many as I can. Not a week goes by without several reports arriving on my computer and occasionally by postal mail, some from missionaries who have been corresponding for years. It's an encouragement for a missionary just to know someone reads their updates

and is praying for the needs of their ministry. Have you reached out to a missionary lately — by email, letter, phone, in person?

The last two months of 2023 in particular were physically challenging for Betty and me. In November, I had a leg vein ablation and Betty had a third sinus surgery. In December, the next day after a surgical follow-up doctor's visit, Betty had profuse sinus bleeding that led to an emergency 10-day hospitalization for her over Christmastime. The stress on her heart from the blood loss has caused heart problems that will take months to heal. Thanks to the Lord, we are doing reasonably well at this point. We ask for your prayers.

Camp Glory Farm Update

he farm is growing in more ways than one this Spring! So far we have had a healthy lamb and kid crop with multiple sets of twins and triplets. We even had our first set of quadruplets ever born on the farm. For goats, there is a 2% chance of them having quadruplets, equaling 1 in every 50. This year, Penelope was blessed enough to be one of those.

As development at Watson's Place slowly continues, more of the ten acres becomes usable. Getting the perimeter fence completed is still number one priority. In the meantime, temporary electric fence was purchased last year. Along with the three permanently fenced acres in the front, the temporary fence allows the back acres behind the barn to be utilized.

Along with the increasing animal population, the garden side of the farm is growing as well. The fence around the garden is going to be replaced later this Spring with taller fencing, something the deer cannot jump. There is

nothing more frustrating than having 14 tomato plants and only harvesting one tomato the entire year. The rest went to feed the deer. There is also a greenhouse being installed! This not only will protect against wildlife, but it will extend our growing season here. This means more food and vear-round fresh herbs! All of the produce grown here on the farm goes to the missionary and staff families here at Siloam, free of charge. With rising food costs, this is very important, and there is nothing better than having access to free, fresh produce. Several of the missionary families end up involved with the work of the garden as well, allowing them to connect with each other and with our staff.

We will have several lambs and goats available for sale later in the spring and summer. Please contact the office if you are interested in learning more or making a deposit to reserve your choice.


blessed to not only keep giving the families a safe place to rest, but also keep them comfortable for years to come.
