Moving from Words to Action

n our recent Christmas letter we shared our desire to dig deep in ministering to the missionary families. We desire to go far beyond housing and really invest in their spiritual and physical well-being to see them strengthened for His service. Studies show that nearly 40% of missionaries suffer from some form of depression. And another study shows that of the missionaries that choose to leave the field and not return, nearly 70% of those decisions were made for preventable reasons. Our goal is to provide that stop gap, that oasis, allowing these families to avoid ministry fatigue and burnout.

They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share. (I Timothy 6:18)

Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. (I John 3:18)

These two verses highlight two aspects of this challenge for us as a staff. One, those that are blessed with God's riches should seek to pass those riches on with a generous spirit. Now as a ministry we may not be blessed with overflowing financial resources, though God certainly meets our needs every day. But we have a staff with a strong spiritual background willing to take our knowledge and experience and pour that out into the families. We will have to make an intentional effort to listen to the Spirit's leading and look for opportunities to act. As the other verse states, we can't just talk about doing something, we need to act as well. As a staff, we are focused on abundantly blessing the families that call this place home. We want Siloam Missionary Homes to be a place that is known not just for the houses, but for the spirit of generosity pouring out of our staff on everyone who comes through the gates.

Please pray that we can live up to this challenge and that we can be a small part of keeping the Gospel going out all around the world. If you do not currently support our ministry financially, consider joining with us and coming alongside as we show God's love to His servants.

BETTY'S RECIPE



BROCCOLI CORNBREAD
This is a good cornbread to have with your cooked greens or with chili or any soup.

Ingredients:

- 1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen chopped broccoli, thawed
- 1 (8 oz.) pkg. corn bread mix (like Jiffy)
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 1 med. onion, chopped
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder (opt.)
- 1/4 tsp. ground red pepper (opt.)

Directions:

Press broccoli between paper towels to remove excess moisture. Combine the remainder of ingredients and stir well. Stir in broccoli (batter will be thick). Pour mixture into greased 8-inch square pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 to 35 minutes.
