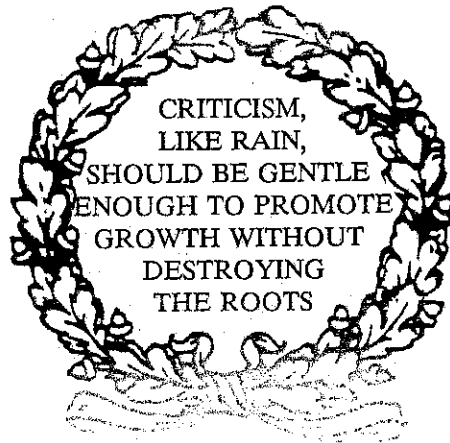
MEET OUR ASSISTANT

"WELL DONE"

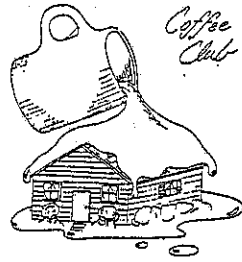
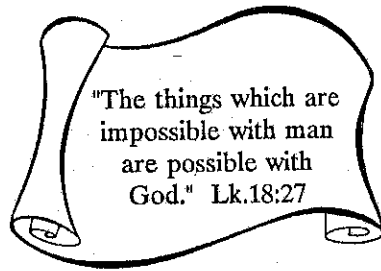
Have you ever felt that you're coming near to the end of the road? Children grow up, move away, get married. I still have a 17 year old son at home, but he soon won't be needing me.
