PRAISE THE LORD! We purchased the property today, Saturday, September 27, 1992. After many months of looking at property, talking with banks and real estate people, it's complete!

Siloam Missionary Homes has purchased 16.2 acres of rolling forest, with a creek running along the side. We paid \$32,000 for the land, which is about 20% below appraised value. It is another miracle which the Lord has done. We have so many things to do and are now creating plans for Phase I. Our first endeavor will be to put a road in and stake out where the duplexes will go. We have enclosed a list of tools and such that we need. (Remember that we are tax exempt, and will give you a receipt on everything donated to

the mission.) Maybe some of you snowbirds would like to come help us during the winter? Give us a call. We'd love to have you.

Please continue to pray for the selling of our home. We are anxious to move and have been given a house to use for three months after our house sells. We have someone wanting the house, but they are having to work out some details to be able to buy it.

I would like to thank all of you for praying for this ministry. To see what God has done so far is exciting, and yet makes us feel very small in His sight.

Our goal and vision continues to be: To serve and edify the Saints of God who are serving the Lord in foreign lands. May God continue to bless as we serve Him.

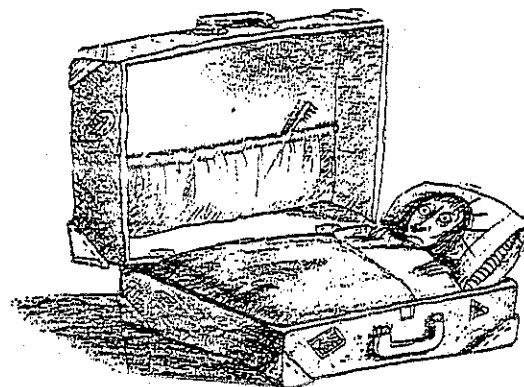

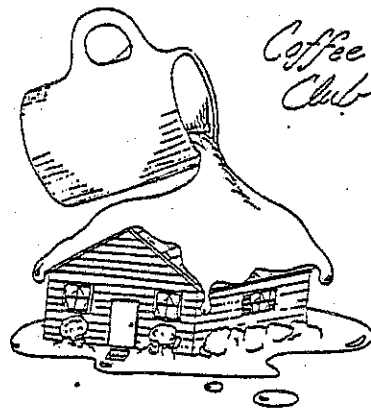
