This picture is a true insight of what is going on these days at the George house.

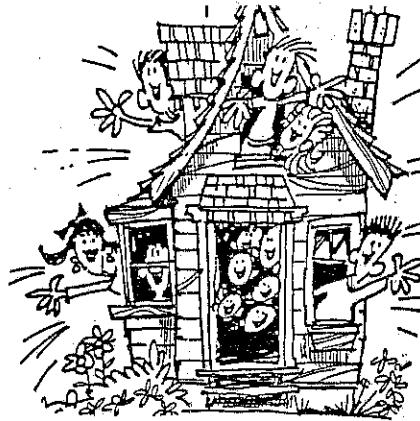
On May 29, 1993, we sold our house with the agreement that we would be out by June 25th. The excitement of packing and tears of memories fill our minds as we fill the boxes. The girls, Rachel who is now 15, and Abbey, almost 12, were 8 and 5 years old when we moved into this house. Through the years we have entertained friends, missionaries, and felt the hugs of people coming and going. My little sister met her future husband in our home, we built a tree house for the kids. I have raised roses, spending numerous hours keeping bugs away, trimming away old branches to make room for the new.

We are now working feverishly with contractors to get the mission home and our home done.

When the price of lumber started to skyrocket, almost doubling the cost per square foot, the Board of Directors decided to investigate alternatives. We made the decision to purchase a 3 bedroom, 2 bath, 1130 sq. ft. modular for our first missionary home. The home meets all the building codes of a stick built home, and will be crane set on a permanent foundation around the middle of July.

We feel confident that, with the Lord's help, our first missionary family will be moved in on schedule this fall.

At the same time, our family will purchase a lot from the mission and crane set a modular on a basement. This home will be paid for by the George's, but we will use the walk-out basement for the mission office and fellowship hall.



We continue to praise the Lord for His faithfulness. Thank you all for your continued support of this ministry.
