"O, sing unto the Lord a new song; for He hath done marvelous things." Ps. 98.1A


I wish I could bring each of you here and let you walk the halls of the new Family Center so you could see each miracle that the Lord used to provide this new facility. This is such an answer to prayer and I see the Lord everywhere. As I look out the window, I see missionary children at play. Last night, I walked into the library to see a missionary busy on his computer, hooked up to the new high speed internet.

Looking back over the past year, truly God has indeed done a marvelous thing in building the beautiful Family Center. This wonderful place has quickly become the hub of what's going on at SMH. Missionaries using the library, children and families playing ping pong and foosball in the fellowship hall. It's great to have the offices in the same building, too.

The Family Center has a library, with a state of the art high speed internet for missionary use, with plans for video conferences. There is a study area, two bunkrooms for work groups or overnight missionary housing. There is a great kitchen as well as a fellowship hall for dinners, games and ping pong. This not only helped fill the need for missionary families here but will open doors to the community. Lord willing, we will host many events, including the home schoolers (many of the missionary families home school), and having a breakfast for our local volunteer fire department and police. We have already used the building for 7 different work groups this summer.

Much time, effort and financial sacrifice went into planning and building this magnificent facility. Ground breaking was in May of last year. Building a commercial building required a special contractor and we used Covenant Builders, who did a great job. Because of the size of the facility and cost of material, we knew that once we got started, we had to finish it. We worked with an area bank and had a construction loan and line of credit equal to \$230,000. With over \$100,000 pledged, we began. The cost of material started to go up during the framing stages. OSB board went from \$8.00 to over \$22.00 a sheet. But we knew in our hearts this was God's will to build. Praise the Lord, we completed the building in record time and even with the rising cost of materials were able to build for \$57.00 per square foot, or \$348,000.00. Our insurance carrier figures the replacement cost would be \$762,500.00.

The Lord sure has been good to us and for that we are so thankful. In closing, please pray for God's provision as we work to pay off the loan. We have seen God do great things and know He will continue to bless. God bless each of you.






