

Siloam Missionary Homes is a ministry which provides temporary housing to foreign furloughing missionaries. They can stay from one day to 3 years, depending on the need. We do allow other Christian workers to stay as listed by priority in SMH Policies and Procedures.

HOW WE BEGAN

Larry was one of nine children raised in Michigan, in a Christian home that encouraged their chil-

dren to go into full time Christian service. Joyce was raised in Brazil, her parents having been with New Tribes Mission for about 35 years. Larry and Joyce both attended New Tribes Bible Institute in Jackson, Mi., and were married in June of 1976. They have two daughters, Rachel and Abbey.



All of their married lives, they have had contact with a number of missionaries in all stages of mission work, whether in training for mission work, on furlough, or on deputation. They have come to love these people, and the work that they are involved in.

The Lord has laid a heavy burden on their hearts for missionary families. While visiting with one of several missionary families that stayed with them one summer, they realized how important it was a for a missionary family to have a place where they can go during furloughs to rest. A lot of them do not have a home to come to when here in the United States. Or maybe they just need a place to get away where they are not in someone's home. After much prayer, a board of directors was formed, and Siloam Missionary Homes became incorporated as a nonprofit ministry in 1992.

This building was originally used as our fellowship hall. After the Family Center was built, this




lovely two bedroom home was completed in 2004. This house was named in memory of Jerry and Ruth Stanton by their children.

Squire Parsons, a native of West Virginia was raised in a Christian home and was introduced to gospel music as a baby by his parents. His father, Squire Parsons, Sr., was choir director in their home church and taught shaped note gospel music.

Squire earned a BS degree in music in 1970 from WV Institute of Technology. He has served as interim music director, church soloist, elementary school music teacher, high school band director. In 1975

he became the baritone singer for the Kingsmen Quartet. In 1979, he went into solo ministry.

Since 1978, Squire Parsons has been nominated by the Singing News fans for "Favorite Baritone," "Favorite Gospel Songwriter," and "Favorite Gospel Singer." He has also been nominated for the Dove Award for male vocalist and songwriter. In 1990, he was presented the coveted Marvin Norcross Award, given for devotion to family, service to church, involvement in community affairs, and contributions to the gospel music industry.

In addition to being one of America's best loved soloists, Squire is a prolific songwriter. In 1981, his song, "Sweet Beulah Land" was voted "Favorite Song of the Year" by the Singing News.

Squire and his wife, Linda, have four adult children.

If you ask Alamance County residents to name a few of the popular gospel groups during the 1950, there's no doubt that **The Master's Quartet** will be mentioned. During the 1950's and 60's, the quartet sang next to the Statesmen, the Harvesters and other well-known gospel groups. The name of the quartet was taken "because we are singing for the Master (God)."

The Master's has sung at revivals, Sunday services, wherever they were asked and have gone from Washington, D.C., to Pennsylvania, Delaware to Alabama.

The group has not traveled since 1968, but have been together several times for reunion concerts.

In April 2003, Siloam purchased 4-1/2 acres adjacent to the existing property, with two homes already on it. This 1,440 sq.



ft. three bedroom, 2 bath home has been completely re-sided and had a new roof put on. It currently is home to the director and his family.



SIMMONS HOUSE 1,800 sq. ft.

In July 1997, construction began on the President's

home, and was completed in November 1998. The home is located in the back corner of SMH property. This home houses the President and his family. The home was named in loving memory of Earl Jennings Simons.

ISLEY HOUSE—3,000 sq. ft.

The first phase of this home was completed in 2001 and was named in memory of Wade and Frankie Isley.

Phase II of the home, the Gary Simmons Annex, a 1,152 sq. ft. addition, provided a 4th bedroom

and a family room. This four bedroom home can comfortably house larger families.





REV. STANLEY BLDG-1,152 sq. ft.


In 1997, a two-story building was completed. The upstairs onebedroom efficiency apartment meets the needs of a pastor or missionary who needs a home for a short period of time.

The first floor is a workshop and has a storage area. There is also an area for missionaries to work on their vehicles. This building was named in honor of Rev. Stanley for his life's commitment to helping missionaries and for his involvement with SMH through Apple's Chapel in Gibsonville, NC.

MICHAEL'S CORNER, the library within the Siloam Family Center, is named in honor of a young man, Michael Workman. Because of a car accident during his mother's pregnancy, the doctors gave the family little hope of his survival. However, through God's healing, Michael has defied the odds against him and is strong—both physically and mentally. He faces a bright future, but not without challenges. Teenage growth causes great strain on the kidneys, but he is a testimony to God's miraculous love.



Michael's grandfather, GRADY WORKMAN, JR. was a man who loved people. He is also memorialized in the Family Center.
