#### SUMMER AT SILOAM MISSIONARY HOMES = WORK GROUPS! Papa's Workshop

"Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Prov. 22:6

Several Saturdays ago, Mike, Henry and I went to Reidsville, NC to pick up wood working equipment. These tools were donated to SMH by Ray Soyars' family. Ray's dad was the neighborhood car mechanic, bicycle repair man. The late Mr. Soyars was also a woodworker. According to Ray, his father enjoyed working with his hands. In our day he would be called "a man's man." He was a person who could figure out how to fix about anything he set his mind to.

Opening the garage door was like stepping back in time. Everything was still in its place, for the most part. Walking around the building, Ray would pick up a tool and tell us a story about something his dad had done with it. Even though we needed the equipment, I hated to dismantle the shop. I realized I was dismantling a part of Ray's memories of his dad. Over the top of Mr. Soyars' work bench was a hand made sign, which read Papa's Workshop."

After loading the truck, as I headed home, I started thinking about my dad. He, too, loved working with his hands. The greatest enjoyment both of these men would receive from their labor was the satisfaction of fixing something someone else was going to throw away. Their projects for family and friends required hours of work and could never be measured by money made.

In a generation of computer, high speed internet, and cell phones, we have lost something. Yes, we have taught our children to play soccer, to swim. We have given them video games and the latest gadgets. But, have we really taught them the basics? How to fix a car, change a tire, repair a broken bicycle? How about repair a broken kitchen drawer, or fix a leady faucet? The Bible instructs us to train the younger generation. Today we are living longer, have more time than ever before. It gives granddads and grandmothers the awesome ability to teach the children and grandchildren. Once I heard someone say, "All we have is time." What a wonderful gift!

This summer we are using work groups to build a workshop – Papa's Workshop. This shop will fill a great need as our staff maintains the missionary homes and all the acres of lawns and woods. Our newest home is a tribute to Mike and Henry and the guys from Hines Chapel that took the red oak harvested off of our own property, stacked and dried it and cut it into boards for the woodwork on the house.
